Homework

Homework is sent home each afternoon in the homework folder and should be returned to school the following morning – completed by the child and signed by an adult. Reading will be set each night and in addition:

- Monday: spellings activity;
- Tuesday: Maths;
- Wednesday: comprehension or Literacy activity related to class work;
- Thursday: Maths.

ICT

Your child will have access to iPads, computers and interactive whiteboards to support their learning throughout the year.

Topic work

Pupils in P2 will develop their scientific, geographical and historical knowledge in the World Around Us (WAU) topic based learning areas. Structured Play areas are based on the Topic. You will be informed of the class topics during the school year.

Please read and discuss aspects of these topic areas at every opportunity.

Pupils will also work on their **Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities (TSPC)** throughout their topic work including: Working with Others, Being Creative, Managing Information, Problem Solving/Decision making and Self-Management. Again please make opportunities for your child to develop these skills at home as well. Ask your teacher for ideas if needed.

LITERACY:

Sounds:

- Individual sounds: s a t p i n then m o c f r u d h g k b then j e v x l n w y z within eve, vec, evec, eeve, eevee words;
- Doubles (2 letters making 1 sound): ff Il zz ss ck sh ch th qu ee oo;
- Others: ing ong ang ung;
- One verbal sound (phoneme) with more than one written representation (grapheme): e.g.o (boat): oa, ow, o-e

a (play): ay, ai, a-e, ey

Words:

Children will progress through the first 100 High Frequency words and then the next 200 most commonly used words. Recognition initially followed by the correct spelling of these High Frequency words (cannot be sounded out)

Reading:

Storyworlds continuing form last year.

Oxford Reading Tree (ORT) – 'Running Records' will be used to test the level that your child is currently reading at and re-grouped accordingly.

Banded books may be used to supplement reading schemes.

Answer short comprehension questions based on a short piece of text - literal and inferential



Writing:

Structure a short piece of writing (fictional and non-fictional), including a simple beginning, middle and ending. Each sentence should include the appropriate use of capital letters, a full stop and finger spacing between words. High Frequency words should be spelt correctly and attention paid to the difference between words which can be sounded out and those which cannot.

Spellings:

Linguistic Phonics Scheme: 4 words which can be sounded out and 2 words which cannot be sounded out (High Frequency words) sent home daily and tested on a Friday along with a dictated sentence.

NUMERACY:

Number:

Horizontal and vertical addition and subtraction;

Addition of 3 numbers:

Missing number in a sequence, forwards and backwards within 50; Even and odd numbers within 50;

Number before, after and between;

Recognise number names zero to twenty;

Ordinal numbers 1st to 10th;

Mental addition /subtraction of 0, 1 and 2 to / from a number within 50:

Mental knowledge of number bonds (stories) of numbers from 2 to 10 e.g. Story of 5: 5+0, 0+5, 4+1, 1+4, 3+2, 2+3;

Mental knowledge of doubles up to 5+5;

Count forwards in 2s, 5s and 10s;

Money: add 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p coins within 20p; use coins to pay for an item up to 20p; give change out of 10p.

Shape, Space and Measure:

Name and describe the basic features of common 2D shapes (square, rectangle, triangle,

circle) and 3D shapes (cube, cuboid, sphere, cylinder, cone); recognise these names; count the sides on other shapes e.g. pentagon, hexagon, octagon;

Time: o'clock, quarter past, half past, what time will it be in X hours; Longest /shortest, tallest /smallest, fattest /thinnest, heaviest /lightest; Days of the week.

Data Handling:

Sort objects: simple Venn diagrams, Block graphs and Pictographs.
(Literacy and Numeracy lessons will be differentiated to suit the needs of individual children.)
